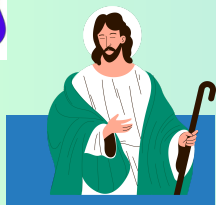
St. Mary's Church GFS Branch, Navatkudah – Confirmation Service

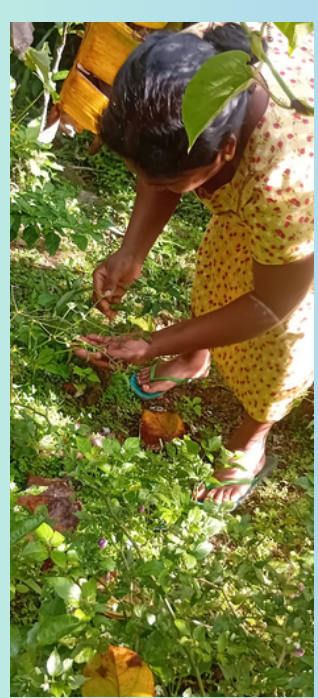

GFS Regional Office, Hambantota - Christianity Classes

Christianity classes at the Regional Office, Hambantota continue to be conducted successfully with the participation of children.

The classes are held regularly at the GFS Office, providing a meaningful opportunity for children to grow in their Christian knowledge and faith.





The GFS World Project English for Employment Prospects (EEP)

Our EEP project proposal, based on a suggestion by the Rt. Rev. Dhiloraj Canagasabey, then Bishop of Colombo, and developed by our GFS, was presented at the World Council in Australia and was warmly accepted. It focused on empowering young women with English language skills to enhance their employment opportunities. It aimed to address Sri Lanka's low English proficiency despite high literacy rates, especially girls affected by traditional social restrictions.

The American College of Higher Education conducted the Course in five batches of approx. twenty girls in the two Dioceses of the Anglican Church. The Project equipped participants with English language skills, effective communication, IT and more. In addition, the GFS conducted motivational programs, personality development training and provided employment support services.

The World Project had a profound impact on the Anglican Church, drawing the attention of clergy and congregation to the GFS and its value. This facilitated the expansion of the GFS through the opening of branches in many parishes and the subsequent increase in membership - in spite of the covid pandemic that brought delays and many projects to a halt.

We are grateful to the World GFS for awarding us this project, which has fostered amazing growth in our GFS and thank all GFS countries that funded the project so generously. Their partnership enabled our GFS to grow from one branch to twenty across the island, empowering women to realize their potential through proficiency in the English language.

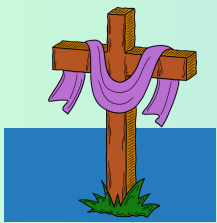


HIGHLIGHT OF THE QUARTER

Talent Show

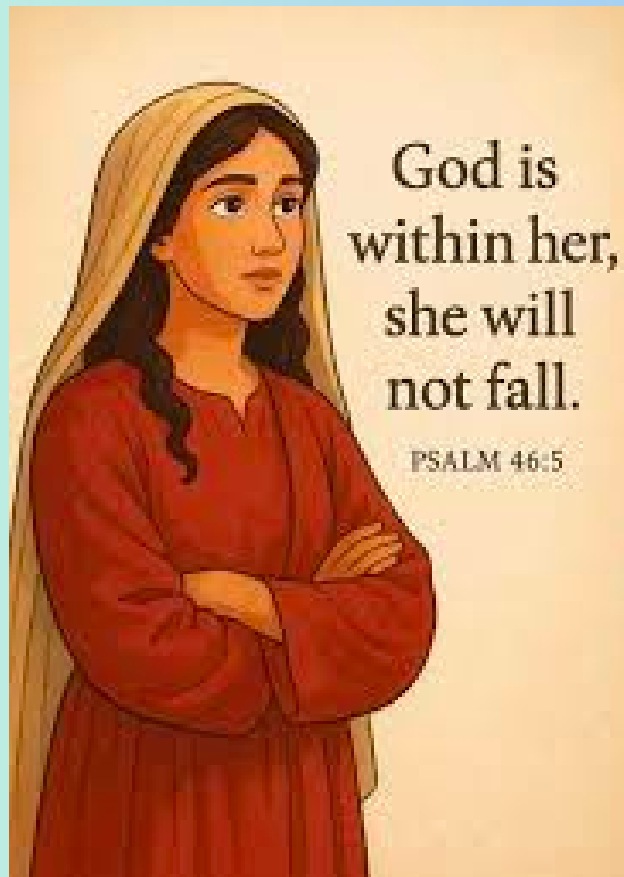
The GFS Talent Show was successfully held at the Headquarters, with the participation of 53 attendees, including 40 children and 13 teachers from 7 churches.
